

Angina Presenting a Hugh Problem

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
Case Presentation


- A 62 year old woman began complaining of exertional fatigue and chest pressure.
- Although she had never been very physically active she felt she was getting less able to do her usual activities.
- An ECG stress test was done and she had to stop after 6 minutes due to fatigue and chest pressure. Maximum HR was 140. ST depression of 2mm was seen in V3, 4 and 5.
- There was no history of hypertension and she had no cardiac risk factors.
- Physical exam: BP 118/68, no bruits or abnormal heart sounds, no JVD, lungs clear.
- Total Cholesterol 170, HDL 56.















